Dear Community Members,

On behalf of the Franklin County Board of Health, our staff, and in service to the more than 500,000 residents served by Franklin County Public Health (FCPH), we are proud to share the release of the Franklin County Public Health 2024 Annual Report.

Public health continues to provide a strong value to our residents and the many stakeholders we work with across our health jurisdiction. Our mission is clear: to protect and improve the health of our community. In 2024, we had the unique opportunity to demonstrate our commitment to that mission by meeting nationally recognized standards. FCPH was reaccredited by the Public Health Accreditation Board which includes a rigorous review of our plans and operations. It also reaffirms our commitment to quality improvement and fiscal responsibility.

This past year, the agency took steps forward in the use and sharing of data to our community, expanding transparency and informing decision making. The 15 cities, 17 townships and 9 villages we serve can now view their own unique surveillance and FCPH program information. To expand our programs and services, FCPH is grateful to have secured additional grant funding from federal and state agencies as well as the Franklin County Board of Commissioners. Many of our offerings can now be more easily accessed online via our enhanced website or visitors can tune into our new "Health is Real" podcast for a fun and approachable take on all things public health.

From a planning standpoint, we continue the implementation for our Community Health Improvement Plan with more than 100 partners. We remain focused on the five identified priority areas, basic needs, including housing and food safety mental health and addiction, maternal and infant health, racial equity and environmental health. FCPH and our partners work to keep the expanded social determinants of health at the forefront of our activities and align with many collective impact initiatives across Franklin County. We are proud to acknowledge staff from FCPH serve in leadership roles with Celebrate One, the Columbus and Franklin County Addiction Plan, Immunization Coalition of Central Ohio, Ohio Environmental Health Association, the Ohio Public Health Association and many others.

Looking back at the last year, we are extremely proud of our achievements and the groundwork that we built for the year ahead. As we start 2025, FCPH has a new strategic plan to guide us. We will continue to look for ways to improve and enhance how we work to improve the health of our community. 
























































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
